Bryant Danner Appointed to Board of Overseers for Claremont University Consortium Former Executive Vice President and General Counsel at Edison International

CLAREMONT, Calif.—Bryant Danner, former Executive Vice President and General Counsel at Edison International has been appointed to the Claremont University Consortium (CUC) Board of Overseers, announced today by Brenda Barham Hill, CEO, and Robert E. Tranquada, M.D., Board Chairman.

Danner was born in Boston, grew up in Pennsylvania and Indiana, obtained his BA from Harvard College and his law degree from Harvard Law School, and finds special pleasure in fly fishing and amateur astronomy. He is a Trustee of the Nature Conservancy of California.
