FRANKLIN E. ULF APPOINTED TO CLAREMONT UNIVERSITY CONSORTIUM BOARD OF OVERSEERS

CLAREMONT, Calif. — The appointment of **Franklin E. Ulf** to the Claremont University Consortium (CUC) Board of Overseers was announced today by Robert Walton, CEO, and Robert E. Gipson, Board Chairman.

In announcing his appointment, Bob Walton stated, “Frank Ulf, as a member of the Pomona College Board of Trustees for seventeen years and Pomona College alumnus and prior member of the CUC Board of Overseers, brings to CUC a wealth of knowledge of The Claremont Colleges. In addition, his leadership in Los Angeles in charitable and civic organizations is extensive.”

Ulf currently serves as the chairman and chief executive officer of Covington Capital Management, a privately held investment management company. After receiving a bachelor’s degree in economics from Pomona College, Ulf served as a Lieutenant combat intelligence officer in the United States Navy during the Korean conflict. Afterwards his professional career was launched working first in Los Angeles for the Union Oil Company, later co-founding the American Investment Counseling Company. He later served as vice president for investments at Scudder, Stevens, and Clark, Inc., president and CEO of Summit Management Company, and chairman, president and COE of U.S. Trust Company-Western Region. Ulf also earned an MBA in finance from the University of Southern California.

Ulf’s additional affiliations include serving on the Board of Directors of many Los Angeles civic and charitable organizations, which include the Autry National Center, California Science Center Foundation, Los Angeles World Affairs Council, Performing Arts Center of Los Angeles County, The Ralph M. Parsons Foundation, Regional Airports Improvement Corporation, YMCA of Metropolitan Los Angeles, USC Andrus Gerontology Center, USC Marshall School of Business, and has been a longtime member of the Rotary Club of Los Angeles.

In reflecting on joining the CUC Board of Overseers, Ulf stated, “I am privileged to be returning to the Claremont University Consortium as a member of the Board of Overseers. Our activities include many of the important non-academic responsibilities that affect all of the seven schools of the consortium.”
