TIM MORRISON NAMED ASSOCIATE VICE PRESIDENT FOR FACILITIES MANAGEMENT AND PLANNING FOR CLAREMONT UNIVERSITY CONSORTIUM

CLAREMONT, Calif. — The appointment of Tim Morrison as **Associate Vice President for Facilities Management and Planning for Claremont University Consortium (CUC)** was announced today by Robert A. Walton, Chief Executive Officer for CUC. Mr. Morrison assumed the position December 1, 2008.

Tim Morrison was most recently appointed in July 2008 as Director of Construction Management and Facilities Planning for CUC. Mr. Morrison has worked for CUC since 1986 as Director of the CUC Facilities Department. From 1990 to 1999 he also served as Director of Facilities for Claremont Graduate University. In 1994 he was appointed the Director of Bridges Auditorium, a position that he maintained in addition to his responsibilities with CUC and CGU facilities management.

Mr. Morrison earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Louisiana State University. Prior to his positions at CUC, he was the Coordinator of Technical Services at the University of Northern Iowa. He has been a member of a number of professional organizations including the Association of Physical Plant Administrators (APPA), Pacific Coast Association of Physical Plant Administrators (PCAPPA), Association of Performing Arts Administrators (APAA), Western Arts Alliance (WAA), California Arts Presenters and the Claremont Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Morrison presently serves on the Board of Directors of the Claremont Golf Course, Inc. and as an advisory member of the Board for the Inland Pacific Ballet.

Robert Walton, Chief Executive Officer for CUC, in announcing Mr. Morrison's appointment, stated, "I am delighted to announce the promotion of Tim Morrison to the position of Associate Vice President for Facilities Management and Planning. Tim has provided CUC and The Claremont Colleges with more than 20 years of dedicated service in both facilities and arts management. Tim's abilities and talents are key for CUC's growth in the years ahead. I trust and appreciate Tim's knowledge of the Claremont Colleges and his excellent relationship with the wider Claremont community. I look forward to our work together as a valued member of the CUC management team."
