TIM MORRISON PROMOTED TO VICE PRESIDENT FOR FACILITIES MANAGEMENT AND PLANNING FOR CLAREMONT UNIVERSITY CONSORTIUM

CLAREMONT, Calif. — The promotion of Tim Morrison to **Vice President for Facilities Management and Planning for Claremont University Consortium (CUC)** was announced today by Robert A. Walton, Chief Executive Officer for CUC. The promotion was approved by the CUC Board of Overseers at its February 2010 meeting.

As Vice President, Mr. Morrison is responsible for Central Facilities Services, a redesigned Construction Management and Facilities service, the CUC Real Estate and Housing office, the Environmental Health and Safety office and special projects such as the East Campus Property development project. Tim is the primary manager for the CUC Land Bank. Tim serves as the lead representative for all building projects, code and ordinance changes, and facilities planning with the cities of Claremont and Upland.

Mr. Morrison earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Louisiana State University. Prior to his positions at CUC, he was the Coordinator of Technical Services at the University of Northern Iowa. He has been a member of a number of professional organizations including APPA Leadership in Educational Facilities, Pacific Coast APPA, Society of College and University Planners, the Claremont Chamber of Commerce, and the Upland Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Morrison presently serves on the Board of Directors of Claremont Golf Course, Inc. and as an advisory member of the Board for the Inland Pacific Ballet.

Robert Walton, Chief Executive Officer for CUC, in announcing Mr. Morrison's promotion, stated, "Tim is an invaluable resource both to the CUC and to The Claremont Colleges, and to my office on a wide range of issues and topics. He has provided CUC and The Claremont Colleges with more than 24 years of dedicated service and is highly regarded within our community."
